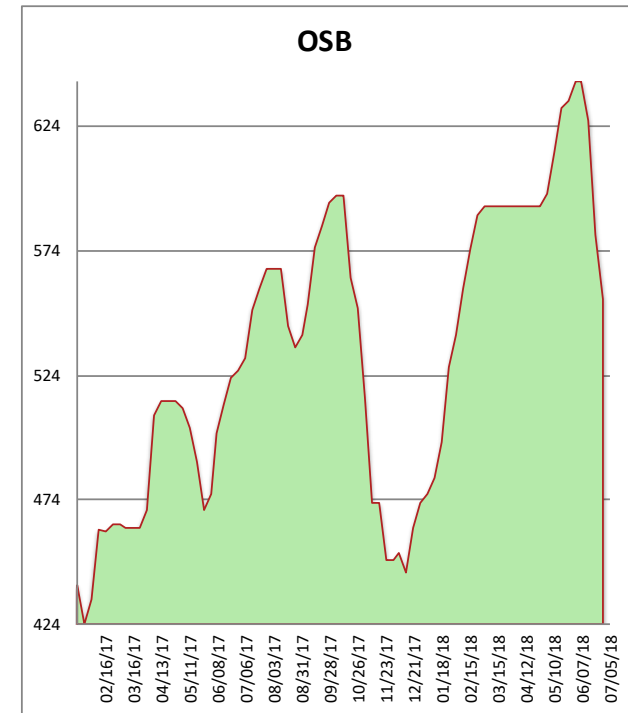
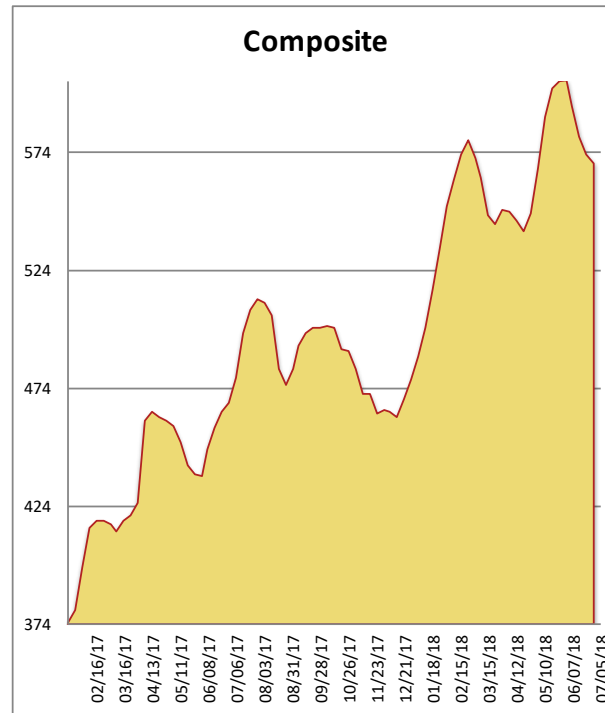

The Fourth of July midweek holiday created dysfunction this week, with many traders, suppliers, and builders taking extended time off on one side or the other (or both). Lumber prices drifted in most species, although a few items did seem to firm up. Summer heat in much of the country added to a sense of slowdown on the demand side. Lumber mills took varying degrees of downtime for the week, but it had little impact on the softening market. OSB continues to see steep price correction and has yet to find a solid trading level in most markets. The dog days of summer are upon us.
