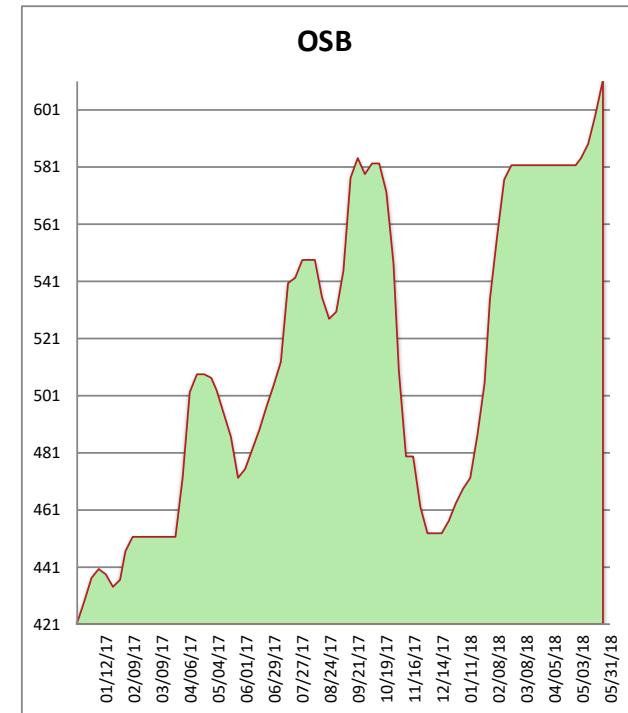
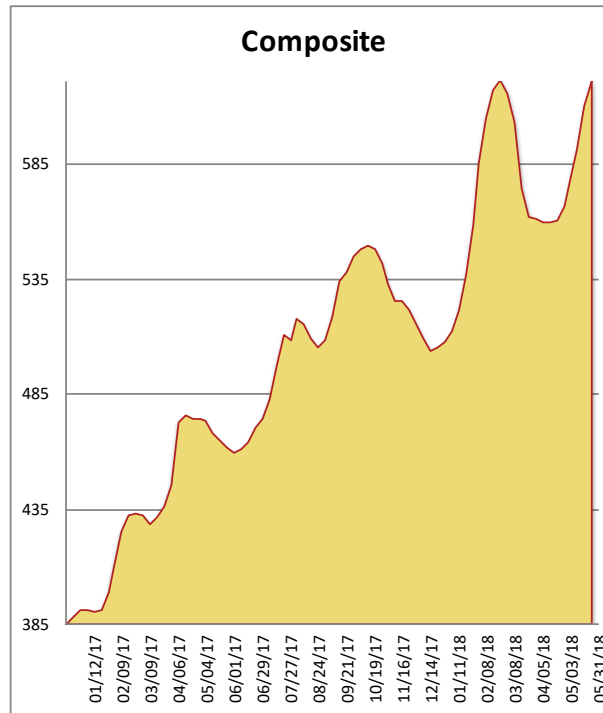

The holiday-shortened work week, record high prices, and wet weather in the Southeastern U.S. all combined to make for a much slower pace of activity and consumption in lumber and panel markets. Speculation that a potential engineers and conductors strike by the Canadian Pacific railroad would cause further disruption in an already plugged up rail pipeline on commodity wood products ended quickly when the CP and the Teamsters reached a tentative agreement on a new deal on Wednesday AM.
