



The holiday-shortened work week, record high prices, and wet weather in the Southeastern U.S. all combined to make for a much slower pace of activity and consumption in lumber and panel markets. Speculation that a potential engineers and conducters strike by the Canadian Pacific railroad would cause further disruption in an already plugged up rail pipeline on commodity wood products ended quickly when the CP and the Teamsters reached a tentative agreement on a new deal on Wednesday AM. When asked to comment about the continued headaches that the Canadian railroads have caused the forest products industry, a CP official in Moose Knuckle, Saskatoon said that the railroad is "Sorry" and are diligently working on the "Pro-cess".
