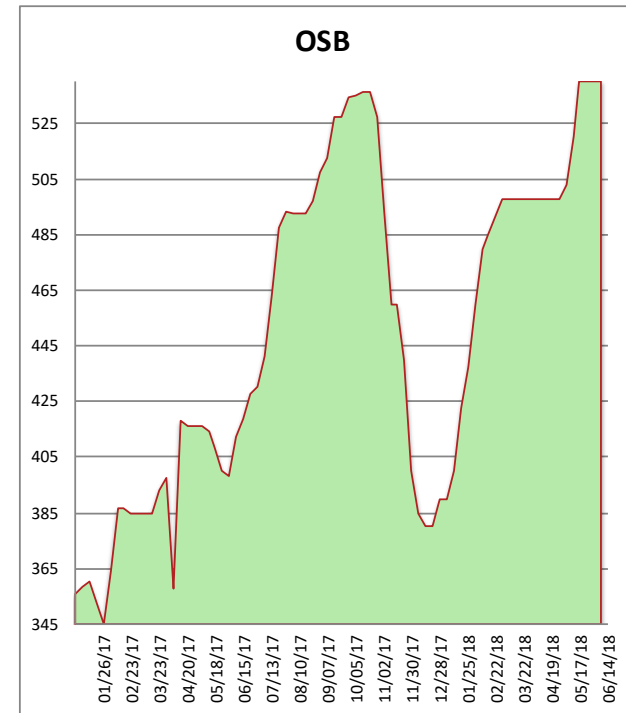
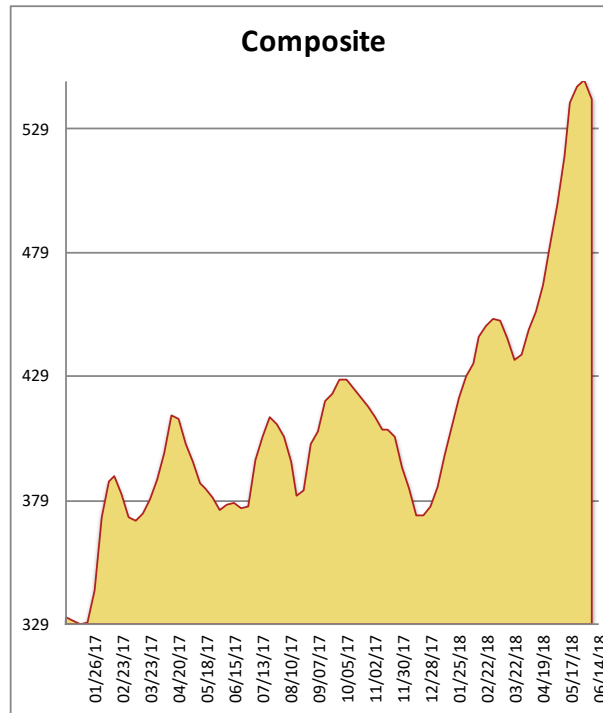

On the heels of softening lumber prices, bearish lumber futures, and rising interest rates from the Federal Reserve, cash markets took a more definitive downturn this week almost across the board.
