


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

The fiber base in SYP took some hits to be sure, but buying was tempered with the knowledge that the bulk of demand based on storm damage will take a lot of time to come to fruition. SPF ticked slightly up, and green DF found a bottom this week after weeks of softness. Plywood saw continued increases, but they appear to be moderating. OSB ticked up a fuzz as well after a prolonged period of flatness, but activity remains lean.
